APPROVAL OF RATIFICATION OF LETTER OF OPINION STATING EMERY COUNTY'S STANCE REGARDING BLM DECISIONS ON THE LABYRINTH RIMS/GEMINI BRIDGES AREA TRAIL CLOSURES.

The letter of opinion is to the BLM to express disappointment in the decision that the BLM chose to make as the final travel management plan. The Labyrinth Rims/Gemini Bridges area is some of the world's foremost and pristine travel destinations for ATV, Jeep, and offroad use. It is also an important destination for its incredible scenery which has long been enjoyed by photographers, locals, and tourists.

The decision made by the BLM to close a significant number of routes will have far reaching effects and unintended and unintended consequences that the BLM may have failed to anticipate. We, as surrounding counties, will miss out on visitation, tax benefits, and our local citizenry will not be able to access roads that have been open for generations.

Furthermore, the counties have been involved in litigation for over a decade related to rs 2477 travel routes and we would request that this TMP be set aside until a final decision is reached on these routes.

We ask the BLM to look for ways in the future to keep routes open while still promoting environmental health and sustaining the multiple use mission it was given by Congress. If the opportunity to open routes that have been closed presents itself, whether it be through and

objection process or a litigation settlement, we encourage the BLM to take that opportunity so that our lands can be more accessible for years to come.

The letter was drafted by Kent Wilson, Staff of Senator Romney on behalf of San Juan County Commission Chair, Wayne County Commission Chair, Garfield County Commission Chair, Emery County Commission Chair, and Kane County Commission Chair. The letter will be presented at each of the respective County Commission Meetings for consideration and approval. Melissa explained that Four Corners contracts with Emery County to provide mental health and substance abuse services to its citizens. That means that Emery County is statutorily required and mandated to provide these services to its citizens. They are always looking for ways to expand in areas and find ways that would be of assistance to the counties. They have talked in the past about their Crisis Receiving Center that will be coming by the end of May. They would like to add a Social Detox Unit to the facility. The unit will help people who want to stop using substances and help them be successful. When talking with other Crisis Centers they have indicated that they all have Social Detox units that have been successful and of benefit from the service. There are Opioid Settlement funds that were sent to the County. These funds are

earmarked for things related to opioid treatment . Emery County was given these funds to allocate funds to entities that could be used with a limited scope of what these funds are to be used for. They are here today to formally request some of the funds be allocated to the Crisis Receiving Center. Commissioner Jensen asked where the Crisis Receiving Center will be located and how it will assist Emery County residents. Melissa indicated it will be located in Price and residents will be transported to the facility. About 20 to 30% of the individuals who participate in the Opioid Treatment program are from Emery County. Commissioner Leonard asked, if this approved today, for an annual report to show how the Crisis Center is benefiting Emery County residents. Commissioner Jensen reviewed theri breakdown of Opioid Settlement funds. They are asking for 60% of 2023 payout and 60% of 2024-2025. Melissa indicated that they are also asking for ongoing support. Commissioner Jensen expressed concern for obligating future Commissioners (beyond 2025) for a continued allocation.

Problems of adolescent delinquency, violence, alcohol and other drug use, school dropout, depression/anxiety, and teen pregnancy still disrupt the lives and threaten the futures of young people. A growing body of research in the field of prevention science now gives us information on how to support healthy youth development and protect against problem behaviors in adolescence. Programs to reduce risk factors and

enhance protective factors have been shown to be effective. The best results happen when communities match tested, effective programs with their unique profile of risk and protective factors. This is the core foundation of Communities That Care. The CTC system takes a practical, evidence-based, outcome-focused approach that involves the whole community in promoting positive youth development. Using prevention science research, we are able to prevent youth behavior problems and promote health development. It can also help us use our money, efforts, and energy efficiently and effectively. By using objective data to determine priorities, implementing programs that have been shown to work and have the tools to measure and track results. They invited the Emery County Commissioners to join them in building a shared vision of our community as a safe, nurturing environment for all children.
